In accordance with Western and Central Pacific Fisheries Commission Boarding and Inspection Procedures, Conservation and Management Measure 2006-08, Australia wishes to notify the Commission of amendments to Australia's list of authorised inspection vessels.

Removal of the following vessels from the authorised inspection vessel list:

Australia understands that it is bound not to conduct high seas boarding and inspections with these additional vessels pursuant to CMM 2006-08 until after the expiry of the 60 day period following the circulation to members, by the Commission, of the register of the Australian inspection vessels.

Australia kindly requests Australia's authorised inspection vessel information to be updated, by replacing the previous submissions with the attached list (<u>Attachment A</u>) and photographs of the authorised inspection vessels (<u>Attachment B</u>).

Pursuant to paragraph 13(a) of the CMM 2006-08, please be advised that:

- listed in <u>Attachment A</u> are the details of the vessels Australia assigns to boarding and inspection activities under CMM 2006-08
- these inspection vessels are clearly marked and identifiable as being on Australian Government services (refer to photographs in <u>Attachment B</u>)
- any of the inspection vessels' crew members undertaking high seas boarding and inspection activities in the Convention Area will have completed training in carrying out boarding and inspection activities at seas in accordance with the requirements of CMM 2006-08.

Please note that, consistent with the requirement in paragraph 13(b) of CMM 2006-08, Australia notified the Commission on the 14 January 2010 that the Australia Fisheries Management Authority (AFMA) is responsible for high seas boarding and inspection. All authorised inspectors conducting high seas boarding and inspections are fully familiar with the fishing activities to be inspected, the provisions of the WCPFC Convention and CMMs in force, and have received training consistent with the procedures set out in CMM 2006-08.

Pursuant to paragraph 18 of the CMM 2006-08, the inspection vessels shall fly, in a clearly visible fashion, the WCPFC inspection flag while undertaking any high seas boarding and inspection activities in the WCPFC Area.

As previously notified, AFMA is the Australian authority to contact regarding the high seas boarding of Australian-flagged fishing vessels or inspections by Australian-flagged inspection vessels. Authorities of the authorised inspectors using this point of contact should provide the name and call-sign of the vessel being inspected, the inspecting authority, nature of the incident (if applicable), contact person and a means of making contact with that person (such as a phone number or e-mail address) so the AFMA duty officer can respond to the notification as soon as possible.
